



We also have to thank June for the graphics for the Show Schedule and Programme and for Linda and Gary for taking all the initial calls from prospective new members in the months leading to the show (and the rest of the year). With these personal introductions and the Society website we are going from strength to strength as a society.

Thanks also have to go to Heather Carrier for her non-stop help from the moment she arrived early morning to the close of doors at 6.00pm, as a runner for the auction, running around with the raffle tickets, putting up and taking down the tanks and time in the canteen, many thanks Heather, it was much appreciated.

Linda in the show hall as Show Secretary had to field all queries and decipher judges' sheets to ensure all the award cards were correct for the right winners and put in the right order for the presentations at the end of the day. Another essential task that is always full on for the whole day, so that a good look round the show hall is practically impossible. So well done Linda – a fantastic job on the day and thanks for the weeks before hand taking entries and ensuring a smooth run on the day.

Show Sponsorship

Sponsorship was gratefully received from Aquarian, Fish Science and Vitallis. The samples sent from each of these leading companies proved very popular with exhibitors, forming part of their prizes and even more popular with the fish, if mine are anything to go by. All three companies provided sinking pellets, that goldfish in tanks seem to relish. My own fish ate all three products without any hesitation (as is not normally the case when introducing a new food into the feeding regime). I ask that all members report back to me on their experiences with the foods given so that we can assemble a coherent response to the suppliers on how the food was received by as many breeders as possible, together with any relevant observations etc.,



Auction

Our thanks also go to Mick and Gary for running such an excellent surplus fish auction, and although there were some bargains to be had, there were also some very good top prices paid for most of the fish on sale. The cost to the hobbyist of producing such high-quality fish year after year has greatly increased over more recent years with fish food and power for heating young fry becoming more of a financial burden since the turn of the last century. This year it was particularly noticeable that Bristol Shubunkins were in great demand, and being a breeder of this goldfish variety myself, quite justifiably so! We'll see what next year's high demand variety will be.

Once again, it was made clear to bidders that if they were out bid on the day, they could always ask a committee member to point them in the right direction of a noted breeder that might be able to supply fish of the quality they were seeking at a later date, in order to satisfy their needs and keep the hobby of breeding top quality fish alive. The auction was well attended with many new faces. Some were new members, making their first appearance at a society event, with others joining on the day itself. Details of all new members can be found elsewhere in this magazine, but to all of them we give a warm welcome and hope to see them at our regular meetings over the coming years. In addition to new members it was really good to see a return visit after some time from Cecilia and Francis Chan and Dave Tidmarsh. Thanks for coming and hope that you enjoyed the day.

Finally, many, many congratulations to Andy Beckett who won the three top awards on the day and congratulations to all the class winners, those placed and all other exhibitors who contributed so well to the big day. Also, not forgetting all the judges for their efforts and skills, who had to spend a good chunk of the day stuck in near silence separated from the rest of us. Meanwhile, all of us non judges spent a lot of the day wallowing in bacon baps, enjoying the humour and camaraderie that is so symptomatic of the AMGK Open Show and led to the show being the highlight of the summer fish keeping calendar.

In addition, it is understood that a number of members have bred the non-standard Butterfly variety. There has been a call to work towards making this variety a new standard, should the agreed protocol for new standards be met and agreed in the next few years.

Jackie Pedley, one member who has designed her future simple breeding programme, has kindly agreed to bring examples of her young fish, together with pictures of the parent stock, to join in a discussion on the variety's pros and cons etc., so far. Andy Barton (our President and one of our current Nationwide Delegates) will be the discussion lead, as part of his roll as variety sponsor for the Nationwide Standards Committee. Please, if any of you have bred, or own, butterflies please bring adults and any youngsters to the meeting to give as broad a picture on the variety as possible. New standard rules are quite clear that before consideration can be given by the Committee there must be a proven interest from a number of fish keepers, who plan, breed, record and exhibit their fish and findings over a number of seasons. This is just the start of the process for a fish that is proving an attractive candidate for consideration.






